

TROOP UPDATE

Wishing you all a very Happy Mother's Day, 2017!! I would like to share with



you a little at a time the true story of one of our soldiers that we got to know through our monthly shipments of cookies. Some of you already know a little about Alex Mirey. Rather than try to cram it all into one article, I will include additional installments of his story in the quarterly newsletters that follow.

I came to know Alex through a thank you letter he sent to my daughter, Jackie for a care package she sent him through her church back in December 2007. I felt there was something very special about this young man and asked my daughter if she would mind if we added his name to our list of military recipients. Below is the letter he wrote to Jackie.

From: Alex Mirey (written by Alex in 2007)

"Happy New Year Jackie! I am truly sorry for the length of time it has taken me to finally reply to your e-mail. I am deeply honored and happy to have received a reply from you. It is nice to finally get in touch with the people responsible for shedding a little love and hope my way. Thank you!

Thank you for going out of your way to share the comforts and love of home with me and my guys out here. To be very honest with you, it's the simple things that people like you do/say, that makes all that we do out here truly worthwhile. After being here for a while, all the politics and military agenda seems of little significance as we press on in our daily missions. After a while, we realize that all we're fighting for are 3 simple things; to come home alive, to keep the dangers and threats thereof away from the people we love and to ensure that the people who count on and support us are not left in disappointment or in harm's way. And it's the actions of people like you and your family that truly make all this worthwhile. With my deepest gratitude and appreciation, THANK YOU for your support!

I've been here since August, 2007. As of January, 2008, we have 11 more months to go. This is my 2nd tour out here. The first time I was here, I was attached to the 1st and 2nd Marine Divisions as their demolitions squad. We conducted missions in Ramadi and Fallujah, took part in retaking back Fallujah from the insurgents in 2004-05. Right now, I'm currently stationed here at Camp Liberty,

Baghdad, Iraq. I haven't taken R&R leave yet and my leave slot isn't until September, 2008. But I don't mind, I like being deployed. I feel that out here, I'm truly making a difference and contributing to all that I signed up to do.

Well, about me...I'm not married, nor do I have any children. My girlfriend of 6 years and I broke up this very day last year. It's a long story, but I guess we needed a little time apart. We still talk and all, and the love is still there, but I guess the distance between us was just too strenuous. It's hard being apart, something I'm sure you know quite well. But anyways, I'm not from the states, nor am I from Alaska or Hawaii. This is quite another long story..eheehee.. I'm from the Federated States of Micronesia, the island of Yap. Under the Compact of Free Association with the United States, we the citizens of Micronesia are allowed the privilege to enlist in its Armed Forces. During WWII, when my grandma (my mom's mom) was a little girl, the Japanese invaded the islands. When I was a young boy back on the islands, my grandma told me countless stories about the war. A particular story that stuck in my mind was this one. That towards the end of the war, in an attempt to avoid surrendering to the U.S. Forces who were gradually taking back the islands from the Japanese, the Japanese soldiers ordered the local populace of Yap into a bunker (along with themselves) and were going to practically blow the whole bunker up. Fortunately for my grandma and everyone else, the U.S. Army landed on shore before all that could have happened. I remember my grandma always telling me how we owe our lives to those fighting "men in green". On her dresser was a very old, black and white picture of her and an unknown U.S. Soldier. She was quite little [©].

"sigh"

Before she passed away, I made her a promise that I would do my part and serve in the Army as long as I could. I feel (just as my grandma did) that we owe our lives, our ethnic existence, to those "fighting men in green". I had initially planned to finish college before I enlisted, but after a semester in college I started to feel restless. I felt as if I wasn't doing enough. And after September 11th happened, I quit college and enlisted. It hasn't been easy, but I haven't regretted a single day that I am alive and serving. And as long as God allows me, I will continue to train, fight, defend, protect and serve

in the United States Army. Proud and privileged to do my part, just as the men and women before me did theirs. And even if this service takes me to my grave, I'll pass on happy and proud, knowing that I've done my time and served amongst the greatest people of my generation.

My parents are both from Yap, Micronesia and still reside there. Though they divorced when I was 10 years old, I was raised, along with my little sister, by my mom and grandma. My little sister is 5 years younger than me, which makes her 20 by now. I guess she's not so little any more, but in any sense, she'll always be my little sister. She's currently in college over in Guam. I miss both my mom and sister a lot! I rarely talk to my dad because I don't really know him much. We grew apart over the years, sad to say. But I intend to visit him when I go on leave. My mom is a great woman, my best friend. I guess you can say I'm a mamma's boy.

Anyways, I'd love to keep in touch. We're constantly on the move; moving from sector to sector. So please do not be alarmed if it takes me a little longer to reply. We're usually out of Camp for weeks, sometimes a month. But I'll always reply back to your e-mails once I get back on Camp. Thank you once again for everything. Take care and hope to hear from you and yours when time allows. May the good Lord continue to watch over us all. God bless"!

Below is his message to his mother and a poem he wrote just for her...very fitting for May being Mother's Day!

To my mom, words could never do justice to the love, care and support that you shower me with daily. My existence would never amount to anything without you mom! I could write a whole book and still not be able to fully express the love and appreciation I hold for you. You will always be the greatest woman that has ever known my heart. I miss you, and I love you! May God's hands always be upon you, until we meet again. You're always with me at heart and in thoughts and prayers mom – always. The greatest woman who has ever known my heart - I love you mom! May the hands of God be upon you, till I'm home again".

(This is a poem Alex wrote.) "I've tossed and turned fallen and nearly drowned time and time again but never once I have frowned because you were with me.. It rained and the winds blew thunder roared and rattled my ears life was a big storm but I was at peace with my fears because you were with me.. When I stumbled and fell and the world turned away leaving me far behind still I managed to find my way because you were with me..

I've set sail into open waters left the comforts that I have known though uncertain of what lies ahead I know that I am not alone because you are with me.. Though vast oceans separate us we are never too far apart for you're the wind in my sails the beat in my heart forever and always with me". signed, your loving son".

We have over \$9000 on hand, including over \$6000 in our Scholarship Fund.

- At a ceremony on April 24, our Treasurer Marilyn Simonds will receive one of this year's two Path of Achievement awards conferred by the Montgomery County Volunteer Center Congratulations, Marilyn!
- In March, we made 36 pillowcase dresses for girls in Honduras, Nicaragua and South Africa. A new seamstress came to our sewing sessions, with good ideas to refine our dressmaking technique.
- Our Spring Luncheon will be held on Saturday, May 20, at the Extension Office, hosted by the Burtonsville club. Cost \$15. Sign-up sheet available. Montgomery College and how valuable the scholarships are. MCFCE is proud to contribute to this effort.

Grilled Corn, Avocado and Tomato Salad with Honey Lime Dressing

The following recipe has such a really fresh taste – perfect for a hot day picnic.

- 1 pint grape tomatoes
- 1 ripe avocado
- 2 ears fresh sweet corn
- 2 tablespoons fresh cilantro, chopped
- 1 lime, juice of
- 3 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 tablespoon honey
- 1 garlic clove
- 1 dash cayenne pepper
- sea salt

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Grill corn for 10 minutes. Cut the corn off the cob and cool.
- 2. Slice tomatoes in half.
- 3. Dice the avocado.
- 4. Chop the cilantro.
- 5. Whisk remaining ingredients in small bowl and set aside.
- 6. Combine corn, avocado, tomatoes and cilantro. Toss with honey lime dressing.
- 7. Let rest 15 minutes.
